

First Sunday of Advent

DECEMBER - ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS

December brings upon us two liturgical seasons - Advent and Christmas. They are seasons of hope and joy. The "Spirit of Advent" by Mark Searle tells us that human beings cannot live without hope, without something to live for, without something to look forward to. To be without hope, to have nothing to live for, is to surrender to death in despair. The Old Testament readings in Advent tell us what the people of old were hoping for. They had the courage to hope for big things - that the desert would be turned into fertile land; that their scattered and divided people would eventually be gathered again; that the blind would see, the deaf hear, the lame walk; that not only their



own people, but all the peoples of the earth, would be united in the blessings of everlasting peace. Clearly, their hopes were no different from ours or from any human being - lasting peace, tranquil lives, sufficiency of food, an end to suffering, pain, wars and misery.

We hope for the same things as the Old Testament people. Their awaited Messiah, the Lord Jesus, has come as the fulfillment of God's promises and he confirms and strengthens our hope. He Has revealed to us that God is not afar off, but is already in our midst.

Advent has a two-fold character of celebrating the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity on Christmas and looking forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight. This is symbolized by the traditional Advent wreath and candles and marked with repentant spirit thru the Penance service and sacrament of Reconciliation.

The subdued spirit of Advent is brightened by the solemn feast of the Immaculate Conception where Mary's privilege of being born without any stain of sin pictures the state of grace that all human beings are called to attain. The figures of Mary as well as of St. John the Baptist in the liturgy are models for the Church in welcoming our Savior, Jesus Emmanuel.

Continuing the Advent spirit is our traditional Simbang-Gabi which are 9-day evening Masses to prepare us spiritually for the joyous birth of our Savior. Already at this time, there is an anticipation of joy and gladness with Christmas carols played over the radio, twinkling lanterns and Christmas lights hanged, Santa Claus and reindeer appearing, fellowships and gift-wrapping being done.

Come Christmas day, the Advent wreath is changed into Christmas tree with all the lights, festive decorations, exchange of gifts, and, of course, the Nativity scene or creche with the images of the Child Jesus, Mary and Joseph, the shepherds and the Three Kings are prominently displayed. The Christmas season continues to the New Year, then to the celebration of Santo Nino and culminates on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

First Reading Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 85:9-14

Gospel

Second Reading 2 Peter 3:8-14 Mark 1:1-8

FOCUS: We must be active in our hope for Christ's return.

Hope is a theological virtue: "We desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit" (CCC 1817). Hope is an active state of being, not passive. During this Advent season we must be fully alive and fully engaged. We must be committed in our pursuit of the Lord; we must be people of hope!

First Reading: *Isaiah* 63:16-17, 19, 64:2-7

Isaiah laments that the people have wandered from the ways of the Lord and pleads that God rend the heavens and come down.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:3-9

Paul gives thanks for the gifts Christ has bestowed while the Corinthians wait for the revelation of Jesus.

Gospel: *Mark* 13:33-37

In the Gospel, Jesus exhorts his disciples to be watchful like servants waiting for the return of the lord of the house.

APPEAL FROM BISHOP LARRY SILVA:



DIOCESE OF HONOLULU - EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL PILGRIMAGE STARTED ON NOVEMBER 1

This Year of Parish Revival is about falling deeper in love with the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus and following him more closely. Mirroring this internal journey with an external one is a beautiful way to connect body and soul in the pursuit of Christ. Most of us will not have the opportunity to join the Eucharistic Caravan on the mainland leading to the Eucharistic Congress on July 17, 2024 in Indianapolis.

We can participate in the revival here at home. Make the Honolulu Diocese Pilgrimage a part of your experience of revival by planning a self-led personal pilgrimage in the next months leading up to the beginning of the Eucharistic Caravan in San Francisco

The Diocese of Honolulu offers a Hawaii Eucharist Revival virtual pilgrimage called **Hawaii Pilgrim** <u>HERE</u> or by getting the **Polarsteps - Travel Tracker app** for your digital device. Sign up for a free Polarsteps account. Enter "Hawaii Pilgrim" on the Explore (Search people & places) tab. Click on "Follow" and begin your journey. Use Hawaii Pilgrim to find church addresses, Mass, adoration and other regularly scheduled events when the church will be open.

*In implementing the Eucharistic Revival program, the Dioceses and parishes have their point persons. In the Diocese of Honolulu, it is *Fr. Alfred Omar Guerrero* and in OLM Parish, *Fran Kovaloff* is the point person. *Fr. Ese'ese Tui* is the head of the Eucharistic Revival Task Force.

You will notice that the words on the logo is in the Hawaiian language. This is to help promote conversation if anyone ever ask what does it mean.

Here is the explanation of the Hawaiian phrase. Thank you, Dallas Carter to writing up this explanation.

"Hō'eu'eu Eukalikia"

In the Hawaiian language, "Hō'eu'eu" means "to rouse" or "to stir up," and "Eukalikia" is a term referring to the Eucharist, the Christian sacrament of communion. Together, the phrase "Hō'eu'eu Eukalika" can be translated as "To stir up the Eucharist."

In the context of our Hawaii diocesan Eucharistic revival, this phrase serves as a powerful reminder to reawaken our appreciation, understanding, and active participation in the Eucharist. It calls on us to deepen our connection with this sacred sacrament and to share its significance with others.

Your parish, vicariate, group may use the logo on your bulletins, social media, website and even shirts. Let me know if you have any questions. Blessings.


