

FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

CANDLEMAS DAY *(Candelaria)* – with blessing of candles

Everyone is invited to bring candles to Mass this day to have them blessed for personal and family use. Candles may also be secured from the church with set offering amount.

WORLD DAY OF CONSECRATED LIFE

This day is observed "to help the entire Church to esteem ever more greatly the witness of those person who have chosen to follow Christ by means of the practice of the evangelical counsels" as well as "to be a suitable occasion for consecrated persons to renew their commitment and rekindle the fervor which should inspire their offering of themselves to the Lord" (St. John Paul II, 1997).

FEAST OF SAINT BLAISE

Saint Blaise was Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia and martyred in the persecution of Licinius in the early 4th century. He is associated with the healing of throats. *BLESSING OF THROATS*

In memory of St. Blaise, the blessing of throats is administered on this day and on February 4 in our Church during the Mass. Each individual will process to the front and the priest or deacon with crossed candles

says the prayer of blessing. The formula of blessing is:

Through the intersession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness; in the name of the Father, and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit.

FOCUS: Jesus taught as one having authority – having power of his own.

When Jesus speaks or teaches, his words have power - for example in today's Gospel by driving out demons. In our lives, Jesus can free us from anxiety and bring us into union with the Father in the kingdom to come. Unlike all the preceding prophets, Jesus does not simply convey God's word and commands, he is God's word in the flesh. His power derives from the Father, for he and the Father are one.

First Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20

In the first reading, Moses says God will raise up a new prophet who will speak the words of God.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:32-35

In the second reading, Paul contrasts the divided loyalties of married people with those who are unmarried and have only the desire to please the Lord.

Gospel: *Mark* 1:21-28

In the Gospel, Jesus commands an unclean spirit to be quiet and come out of a man in the synagogue.



NEW NORM REGARDING EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION TAKING COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

Bishop Silva requests every parish to place the following announcement in its weekly bulletin for three consecutive weeks:

In order to safeguard the sacredness of the Holy Eucharist, Bishop Silva has forbidden that the Eucharist be given to anyone presenting a pyx in the Communion line. Only those who are authorized by the parish priest to take Holy Communion to the sick may receive the Eucharist from the priest after the Communion of the faithful, and never during the Communion procession.



STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

GIVING GENEROUSLY TO YOUR PARISH

As we reflect on our family budgets for the coming year, now is an ideal time to focus on gratitude and what we are willing to give back to the Lord in 2024. It can be easy to become distracted by the busyness, planning, spending and indebtedness we occur around the holidays. But when we turn the calendar page we should prayerfully reflect on what priority we will give to God in our spending.




Christian stewards acknowledge with gratitude that even their financial resources

and material wealth ultimately come from God. Exercising good stewardship over the money one makes, manages, spends and offers back to God is a tangible measure of their gratitude to God and their spiritual health. Giving generously to their parish, dioceses and institutions of the Catholic Church is second nature to good stewards. They prayerfully reflect on their ability to give and return the "first fruits" of their financial resources back to God (Leviticus 23:10). The good steward's desire is to put God first among his or her spending priorities. They take seriously the psalmist's question: *"What return shall I make to the Lord for all the good He has done for me?"* (Psalm 116:12).

The best way to respond to God's loving generosity is by reflecting that generosity day by day. What God does in Jesus' human life is a much-magnified version of what happens when we take time to pray, offer our time and talents to our parish family or when family budgets and spending habits are reprioritized to conform more devotedly to the Gospel. The stewardship question is not, *"Should I do these things?"* but rather, *"How much should I do?"* Take time during these next couple of weeks to reflect prayerfully on God's generosity toward you, on the quality of your own life of gratitude and what you are doing and can do to further God's kingdom by your own giving patterns in the coming year.

DIOCESE OF HONOLULU - EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL PILGRIMAGE STARTED ON NOVEMBER 1 This Year of Parish Revival is about falling deeper in love with the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus and following him more closely. Mirroring this internal journey with an external one is a beautiful way to connect body and soul in the pursuit of Christ. Most of us will not have the opportunity to join the Eucharistic Caravan on the mainland leading to the Eucharistic Congress on July 17, 2024 in Indianapolis.

We can participate in the revival here at home. Make the Honolulu Diocese Pilgrimage a part of your experience of revival by planning a self-led personal pilgrimage in the next months leading up to the beginning of the Eucharistic Caravan in San Francisco.

The Diocese of Honolulu offers a Hawaii Eucharist Revival virtual pilgrimage called **Hawaii Pilgrim** or by getting the **Polarsteps - Travel Tracker app** for your digital device. Sign up for a free Polarsteps account. Enter "Hawaii Pilgrim" on the Explore (Search people & places) tab. Click on "Follow" and begin your journey. Use Hawaii Pilgrim to find church addresses, Mass, adoration and other regularly scheduled events when the church will be open.

*In implementing the Eucharistic Revival program, the Dioceses and parishes have their point persons. In the Diocese of Honolulu, it is *Fr. Alfred Omar Guerrero* and in OLM Parish, *Fran Kovaloff* is the point person. *Fr. Ese'ese "Ace" Tui* is the head of the Eucharistic Revival Task Force.

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL LOGO

Here is the explanation of the Hawaiian phrase. **"Hō'eu'eu Eukalikia**"

In the Hawaiian language, "*Hō'eu'eu*" means "to rouse" or "to stir up," and "Eukalikia" is a term referring to the Eucharist, the Christian sacrament of communion. Together, the phrase "*Hō'eu'eu Eukalika*" can be translated as "*To stir up the Eucharist.*"

In the context of our Hawaii diocesan Eucharistic revival, this phrase serves as a powerful reminder to reawaken our appreciation, understanding, and active participation in the Eucharist. It calls on us to deepen our connection with this sacred sacrament and to share its significance with others.

Your parish, vicariate, group may use the logo on your bulletins, social media, website and even shirts. Blessings.






