



strength. (Note: Only those who are sick are to receive the Anointing of the Sick. No proxy is allowed.)





February 14 is not only Valentine's Day. This year it's also Ash Wednesday which is the beginning of the season of Lent Lent is a season of reporter. version is a reminder that God's work of redemption and salvation continues among us. Today we are marked with ashes which reminds us of our mortality, that "we are dust and unto dust we shall return." Ashes are imposed with the sign of the Cross. Ashes represent

our sins and just as they dry up and blown away, our sins are blotted out through the redeeming action of Jesus our Savior and the love of our merciful God. We acknowledge that we have sinned, always in need of reconciliation with God and with fellow human beings. Over these forty days of purification and conversion, let us put into practice the traditional disciplines of Lent that the Lord prescribed for his disciples - fasting, praying and almsgiving. Let us strive to join our community in the Friday Stations of the Cross, the communal Penance service and Confessions, daily Mass and enriching our minds with the reading of the Holy Bible and watching some holy video presentations so we can join Christ in the desert and are wellarmed to do battle against the evil snares that might separate us from God's mercy, and finally lead us to God's promise of better and more blessed life.

FOCUS: Do everything for the glory of God.

Do everything for the glory of God. Paul's words are both commanding and encouraging. As Christians, whatever we do ought to reflect who we are: children of the Most High God, adopted sons and daughters of the Lord. We are sisters and brothers of Christ, and our very identity should permeate all we say and do. We are encouraged in this endeavor, and aided by grace, so that we can glorify God for his sake, and for the sake of the world's salvation.

First Reading: Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46

The first reading regulates procedures for dealing with people with skin disease. They are denounced unclean and must live alone.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1

Paul calls the Corinthians to give glory to God in everything they do.

Gospel: *Mark* 1:40-45

In the Gospel, Jesus is moved with pity for a man with leprosy. Jesus touches the man, and he is made clean.

❖YEAR OF PRAYER 2024❖

In January 21, during the church's celebration of Sunday of the Word of God, Pope Francis officially declared the Year of Prayer. He said: "Today we begin the Year of Prayer; that is, a year dedicated to rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer in personal life, in the life of the church and in the world."

The pope called for the special year to help prepare Catholics worldwide for the Holy Jubilee Year 2025, which begins with the opening of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica at the Vatican on December 24, 2024.

The year is meant as a time to go back to basics; to discover how to pray and how to educate people in prayer "so that prayer can be effective and fruitful."

The Dicastery for Evangelization said that the year complements the U.S. Bishops' National Eucharistic Revival: "We are well pleased that the American bishops want to call attention to what Vatican II calls the source and summit of Christian life because the Eucharist must be the foundation of every renewal. Therefore, the Eucharistic revival initiative is very appropriate in view of the 2025 jubilee."

APPEAL FROM BISHOP LARRY SILVA:



STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

EXPRESSIONS OF LOVE DURING LENT

This <u>February</u> two events will take place on the very same day. Both *Valentine's Day* and *Ash Wednesday* fall on the <u>14th</u> of the month this year. Valentine's Day encourages us to offer written expressions of our love and affection to others through cards and letters. Why not express our love for the Lord by keeping a prayer journal during Lent?



The season of Lent can be a great time of spiritual growth and keeping a prayer journal can help strengthen our prayer life. Journaling can help us listen more intently to God's voice, track our spiritual growth, and deepen our relationship with the Lord.

There are different ways to keep a prayer journal. You can simply reflect on a passage from scripture, then write down your thoughts and feelings. Or you can write down what the Holy Spirit places upon your heart during prayer. It is important to commit to a specific time and place each day to pray and spend time in silence with God. Then, as part of your prayer experience, write a few lines. Whether you want to express your gratitude, challenges, praises or laments, share them with the Lord in writing.

As Valentine's Day gives us an opportunity to reflect on and express ourselves to those we love, prayer journals accomplish the same thing in our relationship with the Lord. If you're not already in the habit of keeping a prayer journal, try it. You will be surprised by the spiritual awareness cultivated within yourself as you journey with Christ toward Easter.

NEW NORM REGARDING EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION TAKING COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

Bishop Silva requests every parish to place the following announcement in its weekly bulletin for three consecutive weeks:

In order to safeguard the sacredness of the Holy Eucharist, Bishop Silva has forbidden that the Eucharist be given to anyone presenting a pyx in the Communion line. Only those who are authorized by the parish priest to take Holy Communion to the sick may receive the Eucharist from the priest after the Communion of the faithful, and never during the Communion procession.



Sign up for a free Polarsteps account. Enter "Hawaii Pilgrim" on the Explore (Search people & places) tab. Click on "Follow" and begin your journey. Use Hawaii Pilgrim to find church addresses, Mass, adoration and other regularly scheduled events when the church will be open.

*In implementing the Eucharistic Revival program, the Dioceses and parishes have their point persons. In the Diocese of Honolulu, it is Fr. Alfred Omar Guerrero and in OLM Parish, Fran Kovaloff is the point person. Fr. Ese'ese "Ace" Tui is the head of the Eucharistic Revival Task Force.

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL LOGO

Here is the explanation of the Hawaiian phrase.

"Hō'eu'eu Eukalikia"

In the Hawaiian language, "Hō'eu'eu" means "to rouse" or "to stir up," and "Eukalikia" is a term referring to the Eucharist, the Christian sacrament of communion. Together, the phrase "Hō'eu'eu Eukalika" can be translated as "To stir up the Eucharist."

In the context of our Hawaii diocesan Eucharistic revival, this phrase serves as a powerful reminder to reawaken our appreciation, understanding, and active participation in the Eucharist. It calls on us to deepen our connection with this sacred sacrament and to share its significance with others.


