

RITE OF ELECTION

On March 30, at Easter Vigil liturgies in churches across the islands, 241 catechumens will be baptized. The catechumens are no more infants but are of catechetical age. They are also called the elect, and will make public their intention



to receive the three sacraments of initiation which are Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist, in the *Rite of Election* to be celebrated within a Liturgy of the Word on February 18, Sunday at 1:00 PM at the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa with *Bishop Larry Silva* presiding.

During the Rite, the catechumens will sign their names in the Book of the Elect. Then the Pastor or RCIA coordinator will present the book to the Bishop (or Vicar Forane) for his signature.

Parishes are encouraged to use the Rite of Sending Catechumens for Election in their Sunday liturgy prior to the Rite of Election. We shall do it here at OLM at the 9:00 AM Mass. We are blessed to send our three catechumens from OLM - 1) **Deraiah Aloina TUIOFEA**, 10; 2) **Gloria Toriana TUIOFEA**, 8; 3) **Raiden Joseph Kupono KOVALOFF**, 8.

Clergy will not vest for the celebration of the Rite of Election where it is a Liturgy of the Word (except for the Vicars Forane) but are encouraged to participate with the members of their parish.

As a reminder during the period of the catechumenate a rite of anointing the catechumens, through the use of the oil of catechumens, may be celebrated whenever this seems beneficial or desirable. The presiding celebrant for such a first anointing of the catechumens is a priest or a deacon" (RCIA #98). Priests and deacons should arrange for such anointing at least once during the catechumenate, following the directives in RCIA #93 – 103. This pre-baptismal anointing should not take place at the Easter Vigil for adults or children of catechetical age.

It is well to remember that the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist) for adults and children of catechetical age (age 7 or older) should take place at the Easter Vigil itself.

The Rite of Election does not include those who will be received into "full communion" in the Catholic church. These are not catechumens, but persons who are already baptized and are preparing to receive the one or two remaining sacraments of initiation. Although candidates for Full Communion do not participate in the Rite of Election itself, they are welcome to attend as part of the baptized assembly and to support those preparing for baptism.

FOCUS: Repent, and believe in the gospel.

To repent means to feel regret and sorrow and to change, or "turn from" what is evil. Gospel is a word meaning "good news." To "repent and believe in the Gospel" is the twofold call of the Christian, which is brought into profound relief during the Lenten season. This time of prayer and preparation for Easter shows there is indeed cause for regret and sorrow, and a need for change. And yet, what we are turning toward as we turn from sin is always cause for joy and hope.

First Reading: Genesis 9:8-15

In the first reading, God makes a covenant with Noah.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 3:18-22

In the second reading, Peter reflects on how the waters of the flood prefigured baptism.

Gospel: *Mark* 1:12-15

In the Gospel, Jesus is driven into the desert for 40 days before beginning to preach: The kingdom of

God is hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel.

❖YEAR OF PRAYER 2024❖

In January 21, during the church's celebration of Sunday of the Word of God, Pope Francis officially declared the Year of Prayer. He said: "Today we begin the Year of Prayer; that is, a year dedicated to rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer in personal life, in the life of the church and in

The pope called for the special year to help prepare Catholics worldwide for the Holy Jubilee Year 2025, which begins with the opening of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica at the Vatican on December 24,

The year is meant as a time to go back to basics; to discover how to pray and how to educate people in prayer "so that prayer can be effective and fruitful."

The Dicastery for Evangelization said that the year complements the U.S. Bishops' National Eucharistic Revival: "We are well pleased that the American bishops want to call attention to what Vatican II calls the source and summit of Christian life because the Eucharist must be the foundation of every renewal. Therefore, the Eucharistic revival initiative is very appropriate in view of the 2025 jubilee."

APPEAL FROM BISHOP LARRY SILVA:





STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

LENT AND THE DESERT EXPERIENCE

And at once the Spirit drove Jesus into the desert and he remained there for forty days, and was put to the test by Satan. He was with the wild animals, and the angels looked after him (Mark 1:12-13).



Lent is inspired by those forty days Jesus spent in the desert prior to beginning his ministry. Interestingly, the Gospel of Mark reveals to us that immediately after John baptized him in the Jordan River, Jesus was driven by the Spirit into the desert to be tested by Satan. It was during this time of testing that Jesus' resolve and identity were called into question by Satan himself. But when Jesus emerged from the desert, he began to proclaim the Gospel and make disciples (see Mark 1:14-20).

Lent gives us the opportunity to be led into the desert as well, allowing us to remain there for forty days, and challenging us to be tested. The Gospel of Mark uses the word "test" in the sense of proving and purifying someone to determine readiness for the task at hand. The church provides some traditional guidelines for this Lenten testing: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. How we integrate these three guidelines into our "desert experience" is a personal decision. But let us remain mindful that the desert story of the Gospels is our story. Just as we followed Jesus into the waters of baptism, so must we follow him into the desert.

The Gospel inspires us to believe that being tested in the desert is not something to shy away from, but rather to be embraced. Creating a desert experience for ourselves can lead to a profound renewal and restoration of our spiritual lives. Let us take advantage of this Lenten season to embrace a desert experience, and pray that we emerge from our personal desert prepared to proclaim the Gospel and become more devoted disciples of Christ Jesus.

NEW NORM REGARDING EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION TAKING COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

Bishop Silva requests every parish to place the following announcement in its weekly bulletin for three consecutive weeks:

In order to safeguard the sacredness of the Holy Eucharist, Bishop Silva has forbidden that the Eucharist be given to anyone presenting a pyx in the Communion line. Only those who are authorized by the parish priest to take Holy Communion to the sick may receive the Eucharist from the priest after the Communion of the faithful, and never during the Communion procession.





EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL LOGO

Here is the explanation of the Hawaiian phrase.

"Hō'eu'eu Eukalikia"

In the Hawaiian language, "Hō'eu'eu" means "to rouse" or "to stir up," and "Eukalikia" is a term referring to the Eucharist, the Christian sacrament of communion. Together, the phrase "Hō'eu'eu Eukalika" can be translated as "To stir up the Eucharist."

In the context of our Hawaii diocesan Eucharistic revival, this phrase serves as a powerful reminder to reawaken our appreciation, understanding, and active participation in the Eucharist. It calls on us to deepen our connection with this sacred sacrament and to share its significance with others.
