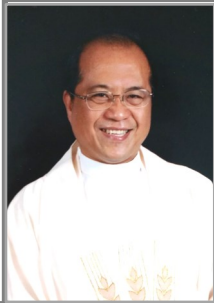

SOLEMN EUCHARISTIC ADORATION ON HOLY THURSDAY

Immediately after the Mass, we hold a solemn procession of the Blessed Sacrament from the Church to the parish hall where there is prepared a "templete" or makeshift altar for all to do honor and glory to our Savior and King. It is an integral part of the Holy Thursday liturgy. Every parish ministry, committee and organization will take turns to lead the prayers until 12:00 midnight when we do the benediction and reposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

FOCUS: Christ became obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

During his journey to Golgotha, Jesus goes from hailed hero to crucified criminal. He surrenders out of obedience to his Father and love for us. As followers of Jesus, we, too, can face loss and sacrifice. Jesus knows what it means to sacrifice out of love. We journey together through loss, never alone, but always united with Jesus.

In the Gospel for the procession, Jesus enters Jerusalem amid an enthusiastic crowd

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

In the first reading, Isaiah speaks for the Lord, despite opposition.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

In the second reading, Paul writes to the Philippians that Jesus emptied himself, *becoming obedient to the point of death.*

Gospel: Mark 14:1-15:4

Mark's Gospel tells the story of Jesus' passion and death.

SECOND COLLECTIONS

***HOLY THURSDAY RICE BOWL COLLECTION – MARCH 28**

From the Office of Social Ministry

Holy Week’s focus on the Eucharistic celebration of the Passover and the Passion of Christ on the Cross helps us reflect on how we can empty ourselves and embrace the cross to be transformed into the hope of the resurrection. The Lenten Rice Bowl program helps us keep in mind the countless men, women and children who today carry heavy crosses of their own in various forms of hunger, homelessness, and lack of security. In these brothers and sisters, we encounter Christ, as he walks that long road to Calvary. In these encounters, the Lenten practice of almsgiving allows us to help in the carrying of the cross of others by charity and acts of mercy and service.



We have also seen Christ in each other during Lent—in our prayers, sacrifices and almsgiving. On Holy Thursday, we celebrate the Eucharist as the sacrament of service that ignites our desire to get out of our comfort zone and become Jesus’ hands, “*washing the feet of one another,*” caring for our neighbors near and far. Let us continue to imitate Christ by generously giving of ourselves with our sisters and brothers here in Hawaii and around the world, remembering that the passion of Holy Week gives way to the joy Easter—when the fast turns into a feast of Hope. And as we celebrate Easter, it is our responsibility as members of God’s one human family to continue participating in the paschal transformation of suffering into joy.

As we end our Lenten journey and begin the Easter Season, let us remember and pray together the Rice Bowl prayer for Holy Week. “*Holy God, Be with us now as we meditate on your Son’s journey to Calvary. Remind us that still, in this present day, many of your children continue that walk to Calvary, carrying heavy, difficult crosses. May we be Simon to those whose burdens are too heavy to be borne alone. May we be Veronica to those who need the touch of love and comfort. And may we, struggling with our own crosses, always remember your promises of justice, mercy and peace. Amen.*”

May all have a very blessed Holy Week leading to a very hopeful Easter season. Mahalo.

EUCCHARISTIC REVIVAL PILGRIMAGE STARTED ON NOVEMBER 1

This Year of Parish Revival is about falling deeper in love with the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus and following him more closely. Mirroring this internal journey with an external one is a beautiful way to connect body and soul in the pursuit of Christ. Most of us will not have the opportunity to join the Eucharistic Caravan on the mainland leading to the Eucharistic Congress on July 17, 2024 in Indianapolis.

We can participate in the revival here at home. Make the Honolulu Diocese Pilgrimage a part of your experience of revival by planning a self-led personal pilgrimage in the next months leading up to the beginning of the Eucharistic Caravan in San Francisco.

The Diocese of Honolulu offers a Hawaii Eucharist Revival virtual pilgrimage called **Hawaii Pilgrim** or by getting the **Polarsteps - Travel Tracker app** for your digital device. Sign up for a free Polarsteps account. Enter "Hawaii Pilgrim" on the Explore (Search people & places) tab. Click on "Follow" and begin your journey. Use Hawaii Pilgrim to find church addresses, Mass, adoration and other regularly scheduled events when the church will be open.



*In implementing the Eucharistic Revival program, the Dioceses and parishes have their point persons. In the Diocese of Honolulu, it is Fr. Alfonso Guerrero and in OLM Parish, Fran Kovaloff is the point person. Fr. Ese'ese "Ace" Tui is the head of the Eucharistic Revival Task Force.



❖ **YEAR OF PRAYER 2024** ❖



In January 21, during the church's celebration of *Sunday of the Word of God*, Pope Francis officially declared the Year of Prayer. He said: "Today we begin the Year of Prayer; that is, a year dedicated to rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer in personal life, in the life of the church and in the world."

The pope called for the special year to help prepare Catholics worldwide for the Holy Jubilee Year 2025, which begins with the opening of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica at the Vatican on December 24, 2024.

The year is meant as a time to go back to basics; to discover how to pray and how to educate people in prayer "so that prayer can be effective and fruitful."

The Dicastery for Evangelization said that the year complements the U.S. Bishops' National Eucharistic Revival: "We are well pleased that the American bishops want to call attention to what Vatican II calls the source and summit of Christian life because the Eucharist must be the foundation of every renewal. Therefore, the Eucharistic revival initiative is very appropriate in view of the 2025 jubilee."
