FOCUS: Jesus' sacrifice seals our covenant with God forever.

As we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we give thanks in a particular way for Christ's perfect offering of himself as the eternal sacrifice. In ancient times, sacrifices of animals, material goods, or even humans were offered to divine entities. These were ritual ceremonies forced upon the people as an act of worship or placation. Jesus, in revealing to all the one, true God, offers his own body and blood for our salvation. This perfect sacrifice has united us to the Father once more, and is the source and summit of our life in Christ.

First Reading: Exodus 24:3-8

In the first reading, Moses and the people offer sacrifices to God.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:11-115

The author of the second reading emphasizes that Christ sacrificed his own blood, an offering far greater than an animal.

Gospel: Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

In the Gospel, Jesus sends his disciples to prepare for Passover. While they were eating, Jesus blessed bread and wine and gave it to his disciples, saying, this is my body, and this is my blood of the covenant.

Father Rafael Capó, Vice President for Mission and Ministry and Dean of Theology at St Thomas University, is a priest of the Archdiocese of Miami, a Missionary of Mercy by appointment of Pope Francis, and National Eucharistic Preacher by appointment of the US Conference of Bishops. He formerly served as director of the Southeast Bishops Office for Hispanic Ministry (SEPI). He has served as school president, vocations director, and professor of Theology, holding degrees in Educational Leadership and Theology. He participates in all major organizations of Hispanic Ministry, the V Encuentro Leadership Team, and is advisor to the National Network of Hispanic Youth and Young Adult Ministry. He is actively present on social media with an emphasis in ministry to young people calling to fitness of body, mind, and spirit.



STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

STEWARDSHIP > A WITNESS TO YOUNG PEOPLE

I have always found this excerpt from the U.S. bishops' pastoral letter, **Stew-ardship: A Disciple's Response** particularly powerful: "Jesus' call is urgent." He does not tell people to follow him at some time in the future but here and now — at this moment, in these circumstances. There can be no delay" (SDR, p. 14). As stewardship leaders, we must constantly ask ourselves these questions: What is our particular moment of life personally and in our faith communi-



ty? What circumstances must we take into consideration as we call one another to live and grow as stewards, especially our young people?

In the first chapter of the bishops' letter, they help us to recognize that embracing stewardship is about living out our particular vocations and acting as compelling Christian witnesses to others. We discern Christ's call for us in the context of the community of believers; we respond to the urgent call of Christ. This is why it is very important that we begin forming our children and teens as stewards, so that they will recognize and respond to God's grace in their lives, understand themselves as disciples of Jesus Christ from a very early age, and reflect on their response to Christ's call and their many blessings as good stewards.

There is much evidence that such real-life, day-to-day faith formation is needed if our youth are to remain actively engaged in a life of faith within the faith community as young adults. In the United States over 30 percent of adults under the age of 30 are now unaffiliated. The majority of these young people leave their faith community before age 24. Young adults tell us they are looking for a meaningful way of life; they want to contribute to something that matters; they need to know that religion is not at odds with science, but rather, that faith brings a larger perspective to what is learned through science. They want and need to learn from the witness of adults who are actively living as faith-filled people in the world. Stewardship provides so much that our young people need. Forming young people to live as good stewards is a gift beyond what most of us can ask or imagine.






CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD LEVEL I, PART A, JUN 3-14
