FOCUS: God's loving presence is with us always.

God is with us, intimately close, just as Jesus was to the man in the Gospel today. In the Mass, Jesus reaches out to touch us and offer his healing. May we always be granted an open heart and clear vision to see his loving presence among us.

First Reading: Isaiah 35:4-7

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah speaks for the Lord, saying to the frightened to *be strong* and *fear not!*

Second Reading: *James 2:1-5*

In the Letter from Saint James, we are encouraged to show no partiality because God chose the poor in the world to be heirs of the kingdom.

Gospel: *Mark* 7:31-37


In the Gospel, Jesus heals a deaf man with a speech impediment and all are exceedingly astonished.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

ST. PAUL'S THEOLOGY OF GIVING: A BRIEF REFLECTION

Usually, homilies, reflections and presentations on the second letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians (2 Cor 8:7-15) often get relegated to Stewardship Sundays, diocesan annual appeal weekends and parish fundraising campaigns. But while this reading for the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time certainly encourages us to think about what we do with our own financial resources and, therefore, should inform our acts of generosity in our Church, Paul introduces us to the deep spiritual dimension of giving.

The text is chiefly concerned with Paul's collection for the Church in Jerusalem which we can see from his letters is a massive campaign. In his letter to the




Paul encouraged Gentile Christian communities to collect money for the Jewish Christian believers in Jerusalem whom they had likely never met.

Ironically, based on the frustration Paul expresses in his letter to the Galatians over the exclusive dining practices of some of the Jerusalem leaders, it is not clear how well these Gentile Christians would have even been welcomed by the Jerusalem community. Yet, this collection binds the Jerusalem community to the Gentile Christians who are now serving as their benefactors and hence, proclaiming the Gospel in a unique and creative way.

To use Paul's language, this collection shows the communities' indebtedness to one another and ultimately to the Holy Spirit who is guiding them. The Corinthians are urged to give generously with the knowledge that God has already provided abundantly for them for this very purpose (2 Cor. 9:8). Let us reflect this week on how the Holy Spirit might be inviting us to consider our own giving patterns in order to proclaim the Gospel in our world today.



DIOCESE OF HONOLULU - EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

A TASTE OF HEAVEN

** * * * * *

Both young and old, laity and religious, and priests and bishops commented that the days of the 10th National Eucharistic Congress were so blessed and such an experience of joy-filled unity that they felt like it was a foretaste of heaven.

The two most powerful moments for me personally were when I got to carry our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and lead people in prayer before him. Both

the opening Holy Hour and Saturday's Eucharistic procession were moments of experiencing the Lord's profound love and delight for his people.

To see 60,000 people - the largest procession in this country in almost 50 years - gathered to show their love and honor for Jesus Christ was powerful. It was as if the whole Church was in procession toward heaven: the various orders of Knights and Ladies, the First Communion children, over 900 women Religious, hundreds of seminarians and deacons, over 1,200 priests, and 200 bishops.

As we processed through the streets to see the people singing and praying, many of them with tears, it was overwhelming. And as we continued, the people joined the procession until all 60,000 of us ended up at the memorial where we had Benediction. What a gift to show our love for Jesus Christ in this way and to experience that he does in fact walk with us on our own pilgrimage to heaven.



On September 1, the OLM FCC hosted the huge gathering of the Oahu Council of Filipino Catholic Clubs (OCFCC) on their 65th Annual Charity Queen Festival & Scholarship Awards. Close to 300 officers and delegates came in carpools and busloads representing the 12 member parish units - Our Lady of the Mount, Kalihi Valley * Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Ewa Beach * Our Lady of Sorrows, Wahiawa * Sacred Heart, Waianae * St. Anthony, Kalihi Kai * St. John Apostle & Evangelist, Mililani * St. John the Baptist, Kalihi Uka * St. Joseph, Waipahu * St. Jude, Kapolei * St. Michael, Waialua * St. Rock, Kahuku * St. Theresa Co-Cathedral, Honolulu.

The event started with the procession of the Royal Court and coronation of the *Charity Queen Norma Bautista Daligcon* of OLM FCC by her daughter *Sharlene Agustin* and Pastor *Fr. Edgar Brillantes*. Queen Norma I then crowned the Blessed Virgin Mary with her escort and spouse, *Adriano Daligcon*, followed with floral offering by all present. The solemn Mass followed with *Fr. Edgar Brillantes*, as presider and homilist, and concelebrated by *Fr. Edmund Barut*, Pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, Ewa Beach; *Fr. After Mass, everyone proceeded to the parish hall and partook of the buffet dinner. Entertainment numbers in songs and dances were presented by the parish delegates. Their respective FCC Unit President handed them their trophies and the 2019 Queen of Charity from St. Joseph Unit, *Flordeliza Garcia*, turned over the scepter and royal cape.

The main purpose of the event is to raise funds for the awarding of scholarship grants to deserving students who are children or grandchildren of FCC members. The Scholarship Awards were presented to the qualified students in High School and College who applied. Recognition was accorded and prizes were likewise given to the top sellers of the fundraising in each parish. The top sellers from OLM FCC were Olivia Mita and Norma Daligcon. Fe Go led her members in an aggressive fundraising that garnered them the coveted Charity Queen seat for Norma Daligcon in a highly competitive race among 9 vying candidates.


