




At OLM, the Diocese designated the Special Collection for October 26-27, 2024.

We are told in no uncertain terms that the only path to greatness in the kingdom of God is the path of self-giving love.

HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS FOR WORLD MISSION DAY 2024

- "Go and invite everyone to the banquet" (cf. Matt. 22:9)

Today, the Vatican released Pope Francis's message for World Mission Sunday 2024. In the text, the Pope reflects on the Gospel parable of the Wedding Banquet, where the king tells his servants "Go therefore to the thoroughfares and invite to the marriage feast as many as you find".

Pope Francis tells us Mission is a tireless outreach to invite others to the Lord's banquet:

His Holiness reminds us that mission implies a continuous outreach to all people, not only by going out, but also by inviting each one in a personal way to meet the Lord.

We must go to the ends of the earth, with perseverance and without forgetting that we must incarnate a tireless commitment to the mission of evangelization.

The universal mission of Christ's disciples in the fully synodal and missionary Church:

In a divided world, the Gospel remains a unifying force, calling people to meet and rejoice in harmony in the midst of diversity. Mission includes a special concern for the marginalized, echoing the parable's invitation to "all, good and bad." It is crucial to remember that we are in a period calling for a renewal of strength and to be a fully synodal and missionary

Church, affirming that synodality and mission are interconnected.

In the parable, the banquet represents a symbol of the definitive salvation in the Kingdom of God:

The invitation to the banquet is linked to the Eucharistic table, where believers share the Body and Blood of Christ, anticipating the final banquet.

The symbolism of the Eucharist, an essential sacrament, paired with the urgency of the evangelization for all peoples in this parable is a strong reminder of the importance of our mission.

Towards the end of his message, the Pope recommends to all dioceses worldwide the service of the Pontifical Mission Societies as the primary means "by which Catholics are instilled with a truly universal and missionary outlook from childhood, and [as] a means of effectively collecting funds for all missions, each according to its needs."

As in all his messages, the Holy Father concludes by invoking the intercession of Mary, who played a fundamental role at the wedding feast in Cana. Mary serves as a guiding force in the Church's evangelizing mission, and her maternal intercession is sought out by Christ's disciples in the present.

Join us in renewing our mission daily, in anticipation of World Mission Day.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Diocese of Honolulu,

Peace be with you!

St. Theresa of Avila was known for her personal holiness, but also for her vision and hard work in reforming the Carmelite Order, which had become very lax. Some applauded her efforts, while others opposed them; but she knew, through her prayerful discernment, that this reform was the will of God, even though it was difficult to achieve.

As we approach the 2024 election, we know that there is much to be reformed in our own country. We have lost a respect for life in all its stages. We have allowed marriage and solid parenting as the basis for a stable society to erode. We have the heavy challenge of not only housing the homeless but of addressing the root causes of homelessness. Our civil disagreement with one another has become toxic, demonizing of those who do not agree with us. While religious freedom once prevailed, there was a general sense that religion was respected for its thoughtful and experienced service of the community, and this, too, has eroded.

We are soon to experience one of the most important elections for the future of our country. It is our duty as followers of Jesus to take our civic duties seriously. We are to be good stewards of our beloved land by **voting**, so that those we elect can embody the values that will truly reform our country. We need to carefully prepare for voting by prayerfully discerning the Lord's will and applying what we discern on the ballot. And even after the election we need to continually pray for our elected leaders and stay engaged with them, so that the gift of democracy that has been given to us can truly flourish.

Please pray, discern, and VOTE! St. Theresa, pray for us!


