EUCHARISTIC ROSARY CONGRESS



On October 5-11, the Diocese of Honolulu will join other dioceses around the nation for the 2024 Eucharistic Rosary Congresses (ERC). The purpose of the ERC is to assist the faithful to fulfill the message of Our Lady of Fatima.

As in years past, our diocese will follow "The Traveling Congress" model. The relay will start on Saturday, October 5 at 6:00 p.m. and will end on Friday, October 11 at 6:00 p.m. Each 6-hour period is held at a different parish or religious community or Catholic school in the Diocese.

OUR PARISH AT OLM IS SLATED TO JOIN THE CONGRESS ON OCTOBER 7, THE FEAST DAY OF THE MOST HOLY ROSARY, FROM 6:00 AM TO 12:00N. We shall start with the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 6:00 AM, celebrate the Holy Mass at 7:00 AM, then resume the hourly adoration and praying of the rosary and culminate it with the Benediction and

blessing of the whole world at 12:00 noon.

Next Sunday's Reading

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading Responsorial Psalm Wisdom 7:7-11 Psalm 90:12-17

Second Reading Gospel

Hebrews 4:12-13 Mark 10:17-30

FOCUS: God desires for us to love and be loved, as he loves.

From the very beginning, the Lord made us to not be alone: we were created for relationship with him and with one another. There is something truly worthy of awe - awesome - in knowing that God, the Creator of the Universe and all things, desires for us to love and be loved, as he loves. We are not just his Creation, we are his children. His only Son is our brother. The kingdom belongs to us, if we embrace it with the childlike wonder it deserves.

First Reading: Genesis 2:18-24

In the first reading, God creates a suitable partner for man, forming woman from his rib.

Second Reading: Hebrews 2:9-11

In the second reading, the author writes about how Christ was, for a little while, made lower than the angels and therefore is not ashamed to call us brothers.

Gospel: *Mark* 10:2-16

In the Gospel, Jesus answers the Pharisees' question regarding the legality of divorce and reiterates the permanence of the marriage bond.

THE ROSARY IS A POWERFUL PRAYER

The rosary is often prayed in church but can be prayed anywhere — even while driving or cleaning.

Rare is the Catholic home without at least one rosary in it.

It might be collecting dust in a drawer, or it might be worn from years of passing through its owner's fingers.

The rosary might be elaborate, with gold detailing and glass beads, or a simple white string of plastic beads with a plastic crucifix and medallion.

Perhaps its owner traveled to Rome and picked it up at a Vatican gift shop. Maybe a child received one from her school to learn its prayers.

With the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on Oct. 7, the entire month of October is dedicated to the rosary. In Hawaii, a number of parishes and religious and lay orders reflect the importance

of the rosary within the Catholic Church.

The Legion of Mary and other devotional organizations, throughout October, visit homes with a statue of Mary and pray the rosary with families.

"It is their way of promoting devotion to our Blessed Mother and an opportunity to encourage families to pray."

Many priests and religious men and women pray the rosary regularly. Bishop Larry Silva said he prays at least two rosaries daily. "When the Maui wildfires broke out in August 2023, I immediately thought that one way we could all help was to pray the rosary for the victims," Bishop Silva said. "We did a 'Zoom' rosary that night, and even though the notice was very short, I believe about 100 people joined us for the rosary."

The rosary — is a deeply meaningful way to meditate. It can be a way for the faithful to express their love, faith and devotion; it can provide comfort or help people focus; it can even work as a way to connect with others.

The rosary invites the faithful to reflect on the mysteries of salvation. The church has identified key events in the lives of Jesus and Mary that originally were grouped in three sets of five — the joyful mysteries, the glorious mysteries and the sorrowful mysteries. Pope John Paul II added a fourth set, the luminous mysteries or the "mysteries of light", in 2002.

The most familiar version of the rosary — a loop containing five "decades" (groupings of 10 beads) — is often linked to St. Dominic, the founder of the Dominican order who was said to have received the rosary from Mary herself in the early 13th century. There's no doubt that Dominicans led the way in promoting the rosary as a form of meditation and prayer.

One of the most prominent early champions of the rosary was Pope Pius V, himself a Dominican. He believed it could help counter the heresies challenging the Catholic Church in the mid-1500s. It was Pius V who established the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on Oct. 7, 1571, in honor of a victory by Catholic forces over Ottoman Empire Turkish forces.



STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

DO YOU WELCOME VISITORS TO OUR PARISH?

As new energy and activity begin to pick up at the parish in September let us be on the lookout for newcomers to the parish. Welcoming newcomers to our parish is not just the job of the pastoral staff, ushers, ministers of hospitality or greeters. It is everyone's responsibility. Here are ten things you can do to provide better hospitality toward those who are new to the parish.

- 1. Cultivate the virtue of hospitality at Mass. Many Mass attendees tend to gather into little cliques and ignore those who are not members of their particular clique. They are not really inhospitable, just heedless to the needs of good hospitality. Make hospitality a new habit when you go to Mass.
- **2. Come early, leave late.** Instead of rushing to Mass to be there on time, and then rushing out at its conclusion, make time to come a little early and linger just a bit later. Make room in your busy life to greet and spend time with others at Mass.
- **3. "The Mass has ended," now go and greet someone!** Seek out someone you've not met before. Introduce yourself and take a few moments to welcome them to your parish home, God's home.
- **4. Welcome everyone.** Not only do visitors need your warm welcome; regular Mass attendees also need a friendly greeting. Develop a good habit of greeting everyone with some enthusiasm. You are Christ's ambassador and greeting others in his name.
- **5. Help newcomers connect.** While you are getting to know visitors, introduce them to other parishioners as the opportunity presents itself. Feel free to invite newcomers to sit next to you.
- **6. Say goodbye with genuine warmth.** After Mass, bid farewell to visitors, inviting them to return next week. Introduce them to the pastor if the opportunity arises.
- **7. Avoid Parish business.** Avoid conducting parish business with others immediately before or after Mass. Focus on newcomers and visitors.
- **8. Give visitors information about the parish.** Ensure that a visitor has a bulletin and other information about the parish before they leave. If there is a social gathering after Mass, invite them to join you.
- **9.** Be part of a greeting ministry or hospitality team. Parishes are always in need of greeters to serve regularly and provide ongoing formation to new greeters. Help out, be a greeter. If your parish doesn't have greeters, now is a good time to start!
- **10.** Greet those who already minister in the area of hospitality. It isn't necessary to neglect the people who are already ministers of hospitality in order to make newcomers feel at home. A simple wave and a smile go a long way.

PASTOR ON VACATION



Amen.



1OTH NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS: A TASTE OF HEAVEN (part 3)

The congress was an expression of the two themes that have marked the National Eucharistic Revival, which came from Pope Francis' exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium* – encounter and mission. From the beginning of the Eucharistic Revival we wanted to inspire a movement of Catholics across the United States who are healed, converted, formed and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist – and who are then sent out on mission *"for the life of the world."*

We experienced these things at the National Eucharistic Congress. We saw both physical and spir-

itual healings, we saw hearts being more deeply converted to him, we had incredible opportunities for formation, and all who came or participated virtually experienced a spirit of deep unity in the gift of the Church.

What made the National Eucharistic Congress so powerful? When the Church is centered on Jesus, and proclaiming his salvation, when the Church prays and honors the incredible gift of Jesus Christ truly present in the Eucharist, God reveals his power. For me, it was a new and deeper experience of God's desire to bless his Church. I found myself repenting for my lack of faith that God can work so deeply in my heart and in the hearts of others. It made me wonder just how beautiful eternity will be.


