PRIESTHOOD SUNDAY

WHAT IS PRIESTHOOD SUNDAY?

Priesthood Sunday is a special day set aside to honor priesthood in the United States. It is a day to reflect upon and affirm the role of the priesthood in the life of the Church as a central one. This nationwide event is coordinated and sponsored by the US Council of Serra International.

Priesthood Sunday is celebrated on the last Sunday of September.

Other occasions to which Catholics are invited to observe Vatican-backed worldwide events are *World Day of Prayer for Vocations* and *World Day for Con-*

secrated Life. In the United States, we also have *National Vocation Awareness Week* and *National Catholic Sisters Week*. *Priesthood Sunday*, however, specifically honors priests, without whom the Mass could not be offered, and Sacraments could not be celebrated.

More than the other events listed above, Priesthood Sunday is a more personal one for parishes and organizations with a chaplain. It is for those who cultivate close working relationships with their priests and therefore could benefit from a special day to express their gratitude. It's a chance to thank and honor priests in unique ways.

It is essential to note that the number of priests and ordinations in the United States has steadily declined in the past 50 years. Meanwhile, the number of parishes without a resident priest pastor has sharply increased in the same period of time. The men who answer the call to priesthood are special indeed, and they are working harder than ever before.

Don't Forget Retired Priests:

Be sure to send gifts and wishes to priest who now live in retirement homes. Take them out for a meal or bring them back to the parish for Priesthood Sunday and whatever reception you may plan there after Mass.

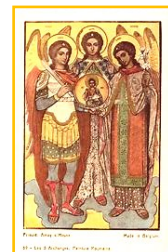

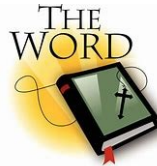

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
Genesis 2:18-24

Second Reading
Hebrews 2:9-11

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm 128:1-6

Gospel
Mark 10:2-16

FOCUS: "Whatever causes you to sin, get rid of it."

"Whatever causes you to sin, get rid of it." This phrase is really the talking point of Jesus' message in today's Gospel, and it's fairly straightforward. If something in our life is leading us into sin, and away from God, that something needs to be jettisoned like the dead weight that it is. We heed similar advice from coaches looking to improve our game, and mentors looking to improve our performance. How much more valuable are these words from the Lord, who desires to improve our life, and for us to share it with him forever.

First Reading: *Numbers 11:25-29*

In the first reading, the spirit of the Lord is bestowed upon Moses and the seventy elders, and Moses wishes that the spirit would be bestowed on all people.

Second Reading: *James 5:11-6*

In the epistle, James gives a warning to the rich, describing the miseries that will befall them because of their exploitation and oppression of the poor.

Gospel: *Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48*

In the Gospel, Jesus points out that *whoever is not against us is for us*. He cautions against anyone who would cause a little one to sin, and instructs his listeners to remove from themselves whatever leads to sin.

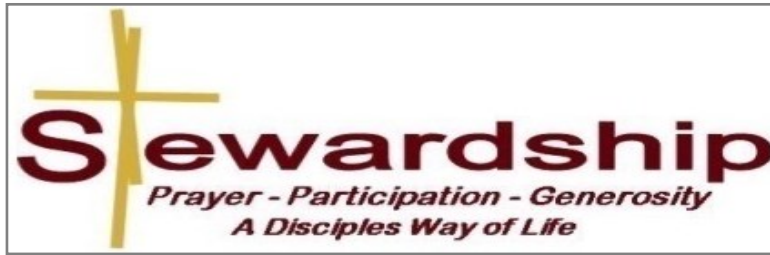
Loving and Gracious God,

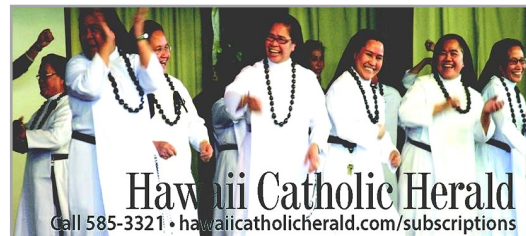

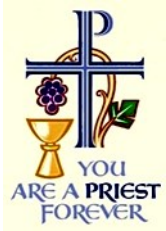

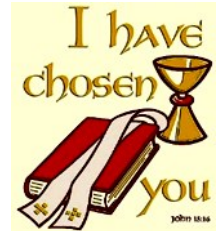

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION**THE EUCHARIST: PROMOTING UNITY IN THE PARISH**

*(Part I in a two-part series on promoting unity in the parish)

The Eucharist is the sacrament of unity. Unity is not an “add-on” teaching about the Eucharist. The unity of the Church is the very reason the Eucharist exists (Walter Cardinal Kasper, *Sacrament of Unity: the Eucharist and the Church*, New York: Crossroad, 2013). Therefore, promoting unity in our parishes is not an option for those who love the Eucharist.

As with any relationship, we have to work continually to build and maintain unity in our Eucharistic community. Sacred scripture enjoins us to make every effort to keep the unity of the Holy Spirit through the bond of peace (see Ephesians 4:3). But how do we “strive to preserve unity” (Eph 4:3)? Here are seven quick thoughts to ponder as you prayerfully consider your role in working for unity in your parish.

1. Remember that your parish is part of the Body of Christ No matter what our differences, we are bound together by one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father who is over all and through all and in all (Eph 4:4,12). Even though we may disagree on all sorts of things, the first step in promoting church unity is recognizing and remaining mindful that all of us who gather around the Lord’s table are members of the Body of Christ and that reality transcends our interests, personalities and personal beliefs.

2. Believe the best in your fellow parishioners. When we are cynical and assume the worst about other people, we are bound to experience some disunity. We should treat those with whom we gather around the Eucharistic table with authentic friendship and remember Jesus’ command: “*Love one another as I love you*” (John 15:12).

3. Stay humble. While emphasizing the importance of unity to the church at Ephesus, Saint Paul urged its members to live “*with all humility and gentleness*” (Ephesians 4:2). Again, to the church at Philippi he wrote: “*Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves...*” (Phil. 2:3). Saint Paul is not telling anyone to be a “*doormat*.” But he repeats a major New Testament theme. When we are mindful of our own sinfulness and weaknesses, we are less likely to act self-righteous and judgmental and more likely to be open and gracious toward our brothers and sisters in Christ.

4. Thou shalt kill gossip. People love to gossip. The motives are varied and they are not good. Gossip is a sure way to create or exacerbate disunity in the parish. No matter how tempted you may be to speak unfavorably about a fellow parishioner, you should commit yourself to building others up rather than talking badly about them behind their backs. As Saint Paul reminds us: “*Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen*” (Eph. 4:29).

10TH NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS: A TASTE OF HEAVEN (part 2)

I believe that one of the reasons the event was so special was that it was a congress and not a conference. A congress is a gathering of the Church for worship, centered on the experience of the liturgy and prayer before the Eucharist. The purpose of the congress is to express our love and gratitude to the Lord for the gift of the Eucharist and to grow in that love. This is why we had the beautiful focus on repentance and conversion of heart, so we can all grow deeper in union with the Lord. I was so grateful for the way the speakers kept the kerygma, the proclamation of the good news of salvation, at the center, inviting all to repentance and also showing how the Eucharist is central to this proclamation of the redeeming love of Christ. I believe it helped us see how the Eucharist, the source and summit of our Christian life, is also the source and summit of evangelization.
