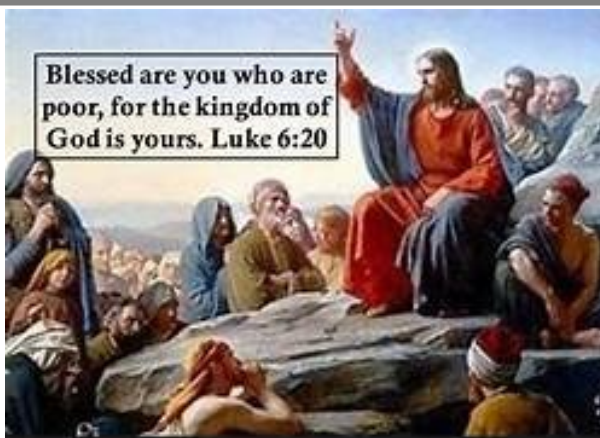

ANOINTING OF THE SICK & ELDERLY



This weekend, at the end of all the Masses, Fr. Edgar will administer the anointing of the sick and elderly with the holy oil. Pope John Paul II designated the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes on February 11 as World Day of the Sick. It is a day set aside to pray and remember our sick brothers and sisters who are united in Christ through offering of their suffering for the good of the Church. Since 1876, Lourdes has become a major center of pilgrimage for many people of faith who find healing in the waters of the grotto's spring. To mark this event, Bishop Silva administered the anointing of the sick and Fr. Edgar did the same during Mass in our church on that day. We extend the celebration of the holy anointing for the sick and elderly, from age 65 up, in our church during the weekend Masses on February 15 & 16. May the Lord and the Blessed Mother bless us with health and well-being.

PARISH BUILDING & MAINTENANCE PROJECT

Our parish has applied to the Diocesan Commission on Planning and Building for permission to install air conditioning units in our Church. We received this week their approval and our Parish Building & Maintenance committee will meet to determine the winning bid or proposal to implement the job. The diocese requires that we seek 3 proposals from different companies or vendors to get approved. The project consists of installing 4 split-type A/C of the highest grade on the makai side of the church. The A/C installation is done side by side with electrical works so there are two sets of contracts to be looked into.

This project came up when the temperature and humidity got unusually intense during the months of last year 2024. This could be due to the much-touted phenomenon of climate change or global warming which is predicted to persist in the coming years. Anyway, it's not a fully centralized system but just 4 units to supplement the existing wall fans when it gets exceptionally hot and humid. We switched them on only as needed, specifically when we are gathered for community liturgy, and when that happens they also help lessen the noise outside because we have to shut off the jalousie windows and doors. We earnestly ask your support for this project which cost estimate is around \$30,000.00. We also ask your prayers that this project may be realized in time for the celebration of our parish 155th anniversary.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION **ENCOUNTER, GIFT, AND SHARING**

February 10, 2025

From the Office for Social Ministry

*“Dear brothers and sisters, We are celebrating the 33rd World Day of the Sick in the Jubilee Year 2025, in which the Church invites us to become “pilgrims of hope.” Hope does not disappoint; indeed, it strengthens us in times of trial. Let us stop for a moment to reflect on how God remains close to those who are suffering in three particular ways: through **encounter, gift and sharing.**” - Pope Francis Jubilee Message for World Day of the Sick, February 11, 2025*

Even in the most challenging moments of sickness and suffering, Pope Francis encourages us to find a deeper promise—a promise of hope and healing. While it may feel overwhelming, he calls us to seek a presence greater than ourselves, a higher power found in God and the gift of His Spirit. Illness, as Pope Francis explains, is not only a way to **encounter** our frailty but also an opportunity to experience the closeness and compassion of God. *“God does not abandon us and often amazes us by granting us a strength that we never expected and would never have found on our own.”*

Suffering can often be a hidden **gift**. It gives us moments of stillness to hear God’s voice and allows us to see the Risen Lord walking beside us as our companion, illuminating our path. It also creates space for honest and meaningful **sharing**. *“How often, at the bedside of the sick, do we learn to hope! How often, by our closeness to those who suffer, do we learn to have faith! How often, when we care for those in need, do we discover love!”* Pope Francis reminds us to treasure the beauty of these grace-filled moments—the smile of a caregiver, the gratitude of a patient, or the loving gaze of a family member. These small rays of light, even in the darkest times, give us strength and reveal the true meaning of life, love, and connection.

This year’s message deeply resonates with the legacy of St. Marianne Cope, a trailblazer in healthcare who cared for society’s outcasts with unwavering compassion. As an empowering missionary woman, St. Marianne devoted her life to patients with leprosy (Hansen’s Disease) in Kaka’ako and Kalaupapa, serving with grace and humility until her passing at the age of 80. Alongside the Sisters of St. Francis, she laid the foundation for modern care-giving systems that continue to uplift kūpuna and their families today. Her mission of love and service continues to inspire and transform lives across generations. For more information, visit www.stfrancishawaii.org.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS SILVER ROSE PRAYER SERVICE



On March 16, 2025, the **Silver Rose of Our Lady of Guadalupe** will come to our Church. We join the Knights of Columbus in honoring the Blessed Lady with the prayers of the Rosary, Liturgy of the Word and Consecration to Mary.

History of the Silver Rose

Our Lady of Guadalupe did so much for her people in Mexico that, in 1960, the *Columbian Squires*, a youth organization of the Knights of Columbus, wanted to give something back to her.

The group of young men in Knights of Columbus Council 2312 in Monterrey, Mexico, came up with the idea of running a rose to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico. The rose was chosen to commemorate Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses, an important part of the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

The first rose was a natural rose and was blessed by Bishop John C. Cody of London. It was then flown to New York, then to Dallas, Texas, and back to the Basilica in Monterrey, Mexico, on December 12, 1960.

After a year, the first rose had decomposed, so a group decided to make a bronze rose that would not age. The Squires of Circle 660 in Monterrey opted to make a similar rose made of silver because it is a precious metal of Mexico.

After 1961, the program was conducted by the Knights of Texas and Mexico and the Our Lady of Guadalupe Province of the Fourth Degree. In the mid-1990s, it was adopted as a Knights of Columbus Supreme Council program. In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson expanded the Silver Rose program further. *“[This is] a perfect program for the Knights of Columbus,”* said Mr. Anderson. *“Through it we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the Order, but we also reaffirm the Order’s dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of ‘One Life, One Rose,’ it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses.”*

Today, eight roses run along different North American routes that include Canada, every U.S. state, Puerto Rico, the District of Columbia, and Mexico. This tradition spreads devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe and embodies international brotherhood as jointly nurtured across the continent.

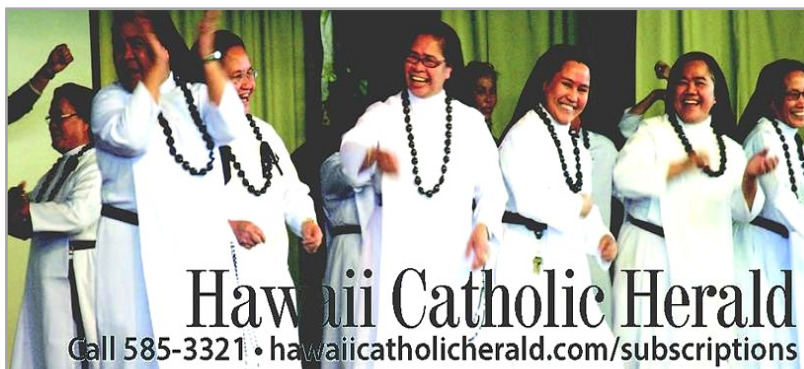

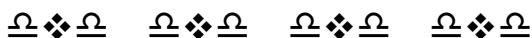

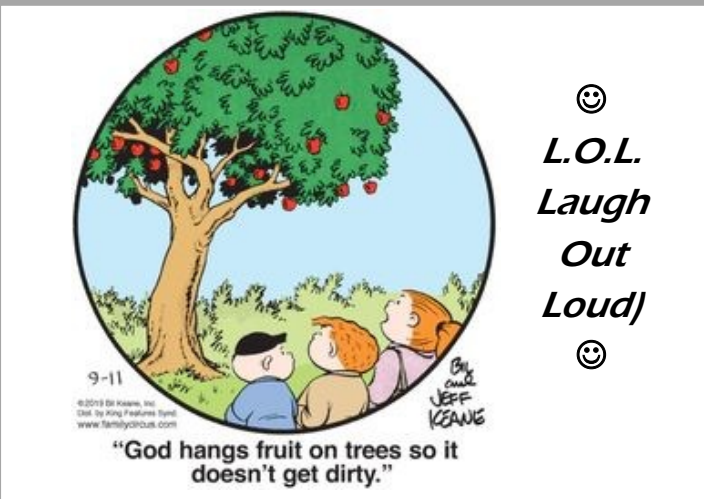
