### CANDLEMAS DAY



This weekend of February 1 & 2 is celebrated as the Feast of the **Presentation of the Lord** in the Temple. It is also known as *Candlemas Day* because there is a rite of blessing and a procession of candles within the liturgy. The candles are blessed for our personal devotions or family use at home. The crossed candles for use in the blessing of throats on the memorial of **St. Blaise** on February 3 will also be blessed.



### BLESSING OF THROATS

St. Blaise is venerated as a Bishop and martyr. He is often invoked in the healing of throats. In memory of St. Blaise, the blessing of throats is given with crossed candles in our church during the Masses on February 1 and 2. The formula of blessing is the following: *“Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop, and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and every other illness; in the name of the Father + and of the Son + and of the Holy + Spirit.”*



### WORLD DAY FOR CONSECRATED LIFE



February 2: On the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is observed as World Day for Consecrated Life. As declared by St. John Paul II in 1997, its purpose is *“to help the entire Church to esteem ever more greatly the witness of those persons who have chosen to follow Christ through the practice of the evangelical counsels”* as well as *“to be a suitable occasion for consecrated persons to renew their commitment and rekindle the fervor which should inspire their offering of themselves to the Lord.”*

We pray for all the Religious Brothers and Sisters, the nuns, monks, hermits, and consecrated lay people.

**First Reading**  
Isaiah 6:1-2, 3-8

**FOCUS:** Let us persevere and trust in God.

We can imagine that Simeon and Anna might have been tempted to give up hope that the Lord would fulfill his promise. But they persevered and continued to trust in God – continued to listen to the promptings of the Spirit – until the day finally came when Mary and Joseph brought the child Jesus and they recognized him as the Christ. Let us follow their example and trust in God on our own faith journey.

**First Reading:** *Malachi 3:1-4*

Malachi prophesies about the coming of the Lord's messenger and his mission to purify the Lord's people.

**Second Reading:** *Hebrews 2:14-18*

The author of the Letter to the Hebrews explains that Jesus shared in our humanity in order to free us from the power of death and intercede for us as high priest before God.

**Gospel:** *Luke 2:22-40*

In the Gospel, Mary and Joseph bring the child Jesus to present him to the Lord in obedience to Mosaic Law.

## JUBILEE YEAR 2025

THEME: "PILGRIMS OF HOPE"



Hope is an important hallmark of the Catholic Church mission to share the light of God's love through encountering Christ with others, especially those experiencing difficult situations. The Pope said: *"To hope is to welcome this gift that God offers us every day to savor the wonder of being loved, sought, desired by a God who has made Himself flesh and blood, history and days, to share our lot. Hope is also a task that Christians have a duty to cultivate and put to good use for the sake of all their brothers and sisters."*

Pope Francis emphasizes that the Jubilee Year 2025 calls Christians to be living "signs of hope" through compassionate actions including becoming closer pastorally to all people "in difficult situations." In his Jubilee message, he lovingly echoes his 2023 Christmas message to marginalized individuals: *"Christ is born for you! Rejoice, you who have abandoned all hope, for God offers you His outstretched hand. He does not point a finger at you but offers you His little baby hand, in order to set you free from your fears, to relieve you of your burdens, and to show you that, in His eyes, you are more valuable than anything else."*

The Jubilee 2025 officially began on Christmas Eve, with the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican before the pope celebrated midnight Mass.

Pope Francis' prayer: *"May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope, to spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth. Amen."* We are praying at OLM the Jubilee Prayer at the end of all the weekend Masses.



# OLM 155TH PARISH ANNIVERSARY



During the Jubilee Year 2025, we also mark the 155<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the foundation of our parish. With God's grace, we look forward to celebrating the milestone with various festivities lined up every month until the grand celebration in August 15 and 17 which is also our patroness' feast day.

In January, we jumpstarted our monthly celebration with the feast of the Infant Jesus, popularly known as *Santo Nino*. We opened the festivity with a solemn Eucharistic celebration presided by **Bishop Larry Silva** and concelebrated by 4 priests and 1 deacon. A procession was made around

the church followed by the traditional *sinulog* in which people danced with the Santo Nino icon to the rhythm of the drumbeats.

For February, the focus is on celebrating marriage and family life. In sync with the secular observance of February 14 as Valentine's Day for lovers, we honor married couples and extol the beauty and joy of living family life in harmony. The Knights of Columbus will coordinate this celebration since one of their Faith in Action programs is to promote family life including the selection of the *Family of the Month* honoree. The Pastoral Council and the ministries are assisting.

We invite everyone - from the parish leaders, ministers, organization members and every parishioner - to participate and get involved. *Ms. Jennifer Jandoc* is the overall coordinator of all the planned activities. Big *Mahalo* to *Jen* and all!

As we strive to do our best to proceed smoothly and joyfully, we likewise ask for your spiritual and moral support. May the Lord continue to bless our common mission and efforts to communicate Christ and convey hope, encouragement, and inspiration to everyone. We are blessed more profoundly than we know because Jesus our Savior is "*God-with-us*", the Emmanuel. We can also trust our Patroness, the *Blessed Lady of the Mount*, to guide and intercede for us. **STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION****FOR PARISH LEADERS: ENCOURAGING PARISHIONERS TO GROW AS STEWARDS**

As parish leaders, we are always seeking ways to encourage parishioners to accept the call to live as disciples and grow as good stewards. This is, as we have noted in previous articles, a process of discernment. We are constantly considering what we hear from members of the community, and how we might help them move more closely toward a new vision of Christian discipleship and stewardship. As we listen, we must identify their challenges and tailor the stewardship message to address the challenges they face. It will be beneficial to identify the challenges in relationship to key themes of stewardship:



**Spirituality:** Do parishioners understand stewardship as a spiritual way of life, or does it seem that they view it as a checklist of things they are supposed to do?

**Gratitude and response:** Are members of the community making the connection between growing in gratitude for the gifts and blessings of their lives and do they respond through giving?

**Discipleship:** Are people growing in their faith in Jesus Christ and commitment to live as disciples?

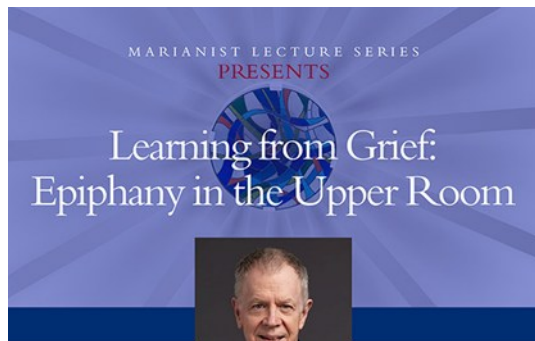
**Stewardship as an expression of discipleship:** Do parishioners give evidence that they grasp the reality of Christ's sacrifice and their call to give sacrificially? Are they connecting their participation in the Eucharist and the call to be grateful people who live as members of Christ's body?

As we listen to people formally and informally, and observe the evidence of current giving in ministry and financial stewardship, we should keep these challenges in mind. Perhaps even carry a small notebook with us, or keep a running list on our phone - of what challenges people speak? If they see stewardship as a series of things they are supposed to do, how might we tailor the stewardship message to more clearly express the spiritual dimensions of this way of life? If people seem unable to articulate their blessings or describe their talents, how might we help them be attentive to the many gifts God has given them? What challenges can you identify as you listen to members of the parish?

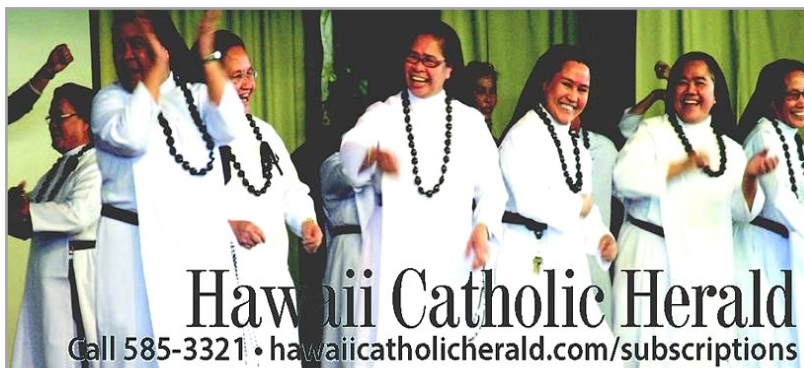

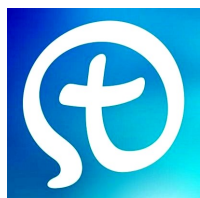

## KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS SILVER ROSE PRAYER SERVICE



On March 16, 2025, the **Silver Rose of Our Lady of Guadalupe** will come to our Church. We join the Knights of Columbus in honoring the Blessed Lady with the prayers of the Rosary, Liturgy of the Word and Consecration to Mary.

History of the Silver Rose

Our Lady of Guadalupe did so much for her people in Mexico that, in 1960, the *Columbian Squires*, a youth organization of the Knights of Columbus, wanted to give something back to her.

The group of young men in Knights of Columbus Council 2312 in Monterrey, Mexico, came up with the idea of running a rose to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico. The rose was chosen to commemorate Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses, an important part of the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

The first rose was a natural rose and was blessed by Bishop John C. Cody of London. It was then flown to New York, then to Dallas, Texas, and back to the Basilica in Monterrey, Mexico, on December 12, 1960.

After a year, the first rose had decomposed, so a group decided to make a bronze rose that would not age. The Squires of Circle 660 in Monterrey opted to make a similar rose made of silver because it is a precious metal of Mexico.

After 1961, the program was conducted by the Knights of Texas and Mexico and the Our Lady of Guadalupe Province of the Fourth Degree. In the mid-1990s, it was adopted as a Knights of Columbus Supreme Council program. In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson expanded the Silver Rose program further. *“[This is] a perfect program for the Knights of Columbus,”* said Mr. Anderson. *“Through it we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the Order, but we also reaffirm the Order’s dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of ‘One Life, One Rose,’ it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses.”*

Today, eight roses run along different North American routes that include Canada, every U.S. state, Puerto Rico, the District of Columbia, and Mexico. This tradition spreads devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe and embodies international brotherhood as jointly nurtured across the continent.
