



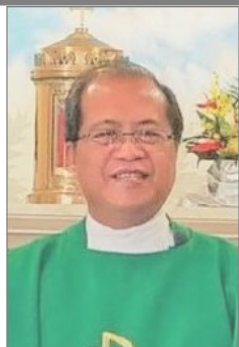

WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

On February 11 is the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. It is a memorial honoring Mary as the Immaculate Conception when she appeared to St. Bernadette Soubirous in a cave at Massabielle in Lourdes, France. This day was designated by Pope John Paul II as World Day of the Sick to pray and remember our sick brothers and sisters who are united in Christ through offering of their suffering for the good of the Church. Since 1876, Lourdes has become a major center of pilgrimage for many people of faith who find healing in the waters of the grotto's spring. Bishop Silva is celebrating on this day the Holy Mass with anointing of the Sick at the Cathedral-Basilica at 12:00pm. At OLM, we shall also commemorate this event with holy anointing of the sick and elderly, from age 65 up, in our church during the weekend Masses on February 15 & 16.

Next Sunday's Reading Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
Jeremiah 17:5-8

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm 1:1-4, 6

Second Reading
1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20

Gospel
Luke 6:17-20-26

FOCUS: *In the sight of the angels I will sing your praises, Lord.*

Both Isaiah and Simon Peter stand in awe of the power of the Lord. Isaiah declares his lips unclean and Peter calls himself a sinful man. They recognize their own lowliness in the face of the Lord's majesty. Paul reminds us that Christ died for our sins and was raised. When we confess our sinfulness, we also acknowledge God's power to forgive us.

First Reading: *Isaiah 6:1-2, 3-8*

Isaiah sees the Lord seated on a throne and declares himself *a man of unclean lips*.

Second Reading: *1 Corinthians 15:1-11*

Paul reminds the Corinthians of the gospel he preached to them that Christ died for our sins and rose again.

Gospel: *Luke 5:1-11*

In the Gospel, after following Jesus' instructions leads to an abundant catch of fish, Peter declares himself a sinner. Peter, James, and John leave everything to follow Jesus.

JUBILEE YEAR 2025

THEME: "PILGRIMS OF HOPE"



Hope is an important hallmark of the Catholic Church mission to share the light of God's love through encountering Christ with others, especially those experiencing difficult situations. The Pope said: *"To hope is to welcome this gift that God offers us every day to savor the wonder of being loved, sought, desired by a God who has made Himself flesh and blood, history and days, to share our lot. Hope is also a task that Christians have a duty to cultivate and put to good use for the sake of all their brothers and sisters."*

Pope Francis emphasizes that the Jubilee Year 2025 calls Christians to be living *"signs of hope"* through compassionate actions including becoming closer pastorally to all people *"in difficult situations."* In his Jubilee message, he lovingly echoes

his 2023 Christmas message to marginalized individuals: *"Christ is born for you! Rejoice, you who have abandoned all hope, for God offers you His outstretched hand. He does not point a finger at you but offers you His little baby hand, in order to set you free from your fears, to relieve you of your burdens, and to show you that, in His eyes, you are more valuable than anything else."*

The Jubilee 2025 officially began on Christmas Eve, with the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican before the pope celebrated midnight Mass.

Pope Francis' prayer: *"May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope, to spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth. Amen."* We are praying at OLM the Jubilee Prayer at the end of all the weekend Masses.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

CHARITY: SIMPLE WORD, POWERFUL OUTCOME

Another year is upon us! Still in the context of our beautiful Christmas season, many of us will answer the questions: *“What will be new in my growth as a follower of Jesus? What tangible changes of heart and habit will I strive for in 2025?”* Perhaps we might even ask those questions as a parish community.

As Christian stewards, you and I could come up with some definite hopes and dreams for our personal and overall parish conversions, especially in light of the encouragement of Pope Francis in his Apostolic Exhortation: *The Joy of the Gospel*. In that document we are called over and over again to shine as the light and love of Jesus in the world.

Pope Paul VI also dealt with the demeanor of the faithful in his decree: *On the Mission Activity of the Church*. In this document, which also deals with evangelization, he writes:

The presence of the Christian faithful in these human groups should be inspired by that charity with which God has loved us, and with which He still wills that we should love one another. (cf. 1 John 4-:11) Christian charity truly extends to all, without distinction of race, creed or social condition: it looks for neither gain nor gratitude. (#12)

The word charity seems like such a simple term, but it generates a powerful outcome. It addresses all areas of the life of a Christian steward including time for our relationship with God, each other the environment and human life. Charity asks us to consider our attitudes towards others, the use of our talents and of course our treasure. Saint Teresa of Calcutta was someone who placed the word within her heart and let it drive her life as a disciple of Jesus.

Perhaps you will make a list of New Year’s resolutions for 2025. Perhaps you will set some simple goals as parish leadership this year. As you sit down to reflect, consider using the beautiful word charity as a guide and see how your resolutions might look different from prior years. Consider how it might help you imitate the life of Jesus more fully. Have a happy and charitable 2025!

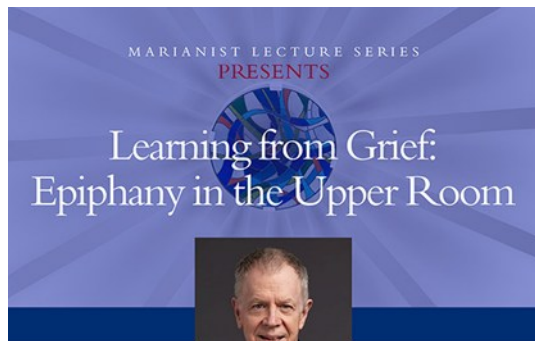

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS SILVER ROSE PRAYER SERVICE



On March 16, 2025, the **Silver Rose of Our Lady of Guadalupe** will come to our Church. We join the Knights of Columbus in honoring the Blessed Lady with the prayers of the Rosary, Liturgy of the Word and Consecration to Mary.

History of the Silver Rose

Our Lady of Guadalupe did so much for her people in Mexico that, in 1960, the *Columbian Squires*, a youth organization of the Knights of Columbus, wanted to give something back to her.

The group of young men in Knights of Columbus Council 2312 in Monterrey, Mexico, came up with the idea of running a rose to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico. The rose was chosen to commemorate Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses, an important part of the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

The first rose was a natural rose and was blessed by Bishop John C. Cody of London. It was then flown to New York, then to Dallas, Texas, and back to the Basilica in Monterrey, Mexico, on December 12, 1960.

After a year, the first rose had decomposed, so a group decided to make a bronze rose that would not age. The Squires of Circle 660 in Monterrey opted to make a similar rose made of silver because it is a precious metal of Mexico.

After 1961, the program was conducted by the Knights of Texas and Mexico and the Our Lady of Guadalupe Province of the Fourth Degree. In the mid-1990s, it was adopted as a Knights of Columbus Supreme Council program. In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson expanded the Silver Rose program further. *“[This is] a perfect program for the Knights of Columbus,”* said Mr. Anderson. *“Through it we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the Order, but we also reaffirm the Order’s dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of ‘One Life, One Rose,’ it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses.”*

Today, eight roses run along different North American routes that include Canada, every U.S. state, Puerto Rico, the District of Columbia, and Mexico. This tradition spreads devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe and embodies international brotherhood as jointly nurtured across the continent.

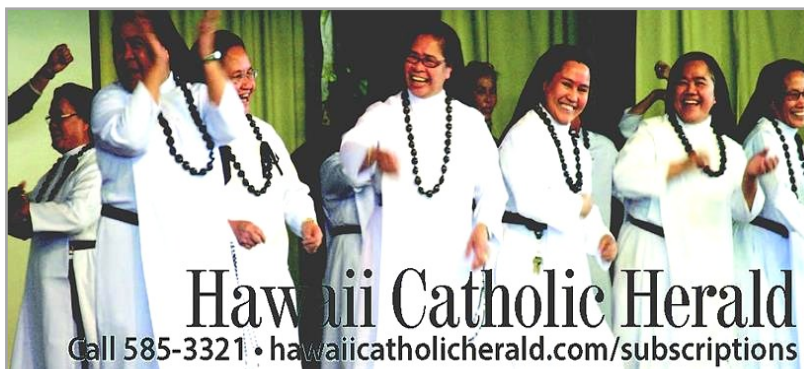
