

FOCUS Contemplate with wonder and awe the beauty of God.

The Church invites us to explore humbly the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity and to grapple with the truths of this fundamental insight into the essence of God's being. The three Persons of the Holy Trinity – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – are one, but are distinct from each other. Thus, we can say they are in relationship with one another – an eternal communion of love. Confronted with this mystery, let us contemplate with wonder and awe the beauty of God.

First Reading: Proverbs 8:22-31

In the first reading, the wisdom of God speaks of being present when the Lord established the heavens, *beside him as his craftsman*.

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-5

In the Epistle Paul writes, *we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ*, and that the Holy Spirit has been given to us.

Gospel: John 16:12-15

In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that the Spirit of truth will guide them to all truth, declaring to them everything that is his.

PASTOR'S SABBATICAL

Our Pastor, Fr. Edgar, has been granted a sabbatical by Bishop Larry Silva.


A sabbatical is an extended renewal period granted by the Bishop for the purpose of study and personal spiritual development. Its purpose is to promote personal renewal and foster ministerial effectiveness. A sabbatical is time invested to enhance ministry. Its ultimate purpose is to provide the individual priest with renewed motivation for serving the people of God. It is not ordinarily for an academic degree.

A priest of the Diocese is eligible for a sabbatical after ten years of service and every seven years thereafter. Fr. Edgar has been serving in the Diocese of Honolulu for 25 years since 1999 and it is only now that he is taking a sabbatical. Since he continues in the active ministry after the priests' retirement age of 70, it is recommended that he goes for sabbatical. Sabbaticals are ordinarily granted for a period of about 4 months or a semester and with the understanding that the priest intends to return to ministry in the Diocese. Fr. Edgar's sabbatical is only 2 months and will return to the Diocese after. For the month of June, Fr. Edgar will go to the *Blessed Peter Faber Spirituality Center* of the Jesuits in the Philippines. In July, he will be at the *St. Meinrad Institute for Priests and Presbyterates* in Indiana, USA.

The Bishop in consultation with the Personnel Board is responsible for providing priest to administer the parish and celebrate the sacraments while Fr. Edgar is away. The Bishop named the newly-ordained priest, **Fr. Preston-Jay Castro**, and **Fr. Khanh Hoang**, the Administrative assistant to the Bishop, to cover for the month of June while **Fr. Nicholas Apetorgbor**, the current Administrator of St. Catherine Church in Kapaa, Kauai will cover the month of July. They will be staying in the Rectory.





STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION: STEWARDSHIP: LIVING OUR VOCATIONS

I have always found this excerpt from the U.S. bishops' pastoral letter, *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response* particularly powerful: "Jesus' call is urgent. He does not tell people to follow him at some time in the future but here and now — at this moment, in these circumstances. There can be no delay" (SDR, p. 14). As stewardship leaders, we must constantly ask ourselves these questions: What is our particular moment of life personally and in our faith community? What circumstances must we take into consideration as we call one another to live and grow as stewards?

In the first chapter of the bishops' letter, they help us to recognize that embracing stewardship is about living out our particular vocations. We discern Christ's call for us in the context of the community of believers; we respond to the urgent call of Christ. This is why it is very important that we begin forming our children and teens as stewards, so that they will recognize and respond to God's grace in their lives, understand themselves as disciples of Jesus Christ from a very early age, and reflect on their response to Christ's call and their many blessings as good stewards.

There is much evidence that such real-life, day-to-day faith formation is needed if our children are to remain actively engaged in a life of faith within the faith community as young adults. In the United States over 30 percent of adults under the age of 30 are now unaffiliated. The majority of these young people leave their congregation before age 24. Young adults tell us they are looking for a meaningful way of life; they want to contribute to something that matters; they need to know that religion is not at odds with science, but rather, that faith brings a larger perspective to what is learned through science. They want and need to learn from the witness of adults who are actively living as faith-filled people in the world. Stewardship provides so much that our young people need! Forming people to live their vocations as disciples who live as stewards is a gift beyond what most of us can ask or imagine.





**WHAT IS JUNETEENTH?**

The holiday commemorates the [Emancipation Proclamation](#) in the U.S. President Abraham Lincoln issued the proclamation to free enslaved African Americans in secessionist states on January 1, 1863, but enslaved people in Galveston, Texas, would not learn of their freedom until two years later.

On June 19, 1865, [Maj. Gen. Gordon Granger informed the community of Galveston of Lincoln's proclamation](#). Although enslaved people had been officially emancipated years prior, enslavers responsible for telling them ignored the order until Union troops arrived to enforce it, founder of [Juneteenth.com](#) [Cliff Robinson earlier told USA TODAY](#). Texas was the last Confederate state to have the proclamation announced.

Though the story of Texas' emancipation is the most widely known, president of the National Juneteenth Observance Foundation Steve Williams previously told USA TODAY, other significant events in the history of emancipation took place on and around that date. He said the first known Juneteenth celebrations began in 1866 and spread across the country as African Americans migrated to new cities.

Why is it called Juneteenth?

Juneteenth is a combination of "June" and "nineteenth," in honor of the day that Granger announced the abolition of slavery in Texas. The holiday is also known as Freedom Day or Emancipation Day.
