The 250th birthday of the United

States, celebrated on July 4, 2026, marks 250 years since the adoption of the Declaration of Independence in 1776. The nationwide commemoration—officially branded Freedom250—is planned as a large, year-long series of events honoring American history, civic ideals, and cultural heritage.

The semi-quincentennial highlights the moment when the thirteen colonies formally declared independence from Great Britain, beginning the political journey that shaped the modern United States. Federal, state, and local governments, along with private organizations and citizens, are encouraged to participate in the celebration.

In summary, the USA's 250th birthday in 2026 is a historic, large-scale celebration of American independence, featuring national ceremonies, fireworks, cultural exhibitions, and community events across the country—echoing the spirit of the 1976 Bicentennial but on an even grander scale.

A Time for Witness

In his 2026 pastoral letter, *In Charity & Truth: Toward a Renewed Political Culture*, Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori challenges Catholics to respond to the political crisis by cultivating virtue and bearing witness to Jesus Christ. "Anniversaries are not merely occasions for nostalgia or celebration," he writes. "Authentic remembrance always orients us toward renewal; it calls us to consider not only who we have been, and who we are becoming — but, by God's grace, who we are called to be."

United 'Under God'

In 1951, the **Knights of Columbus** began a campaign to add the words "under God" to the U.S. Pledge of Allegiance. Grounded in historical precedent and a grassroots movement, the effort reached Congress and culminated when President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed a bill amending the Pledge on Flag Day, June 14, 1954.

Jesus invited the people, saying, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest."



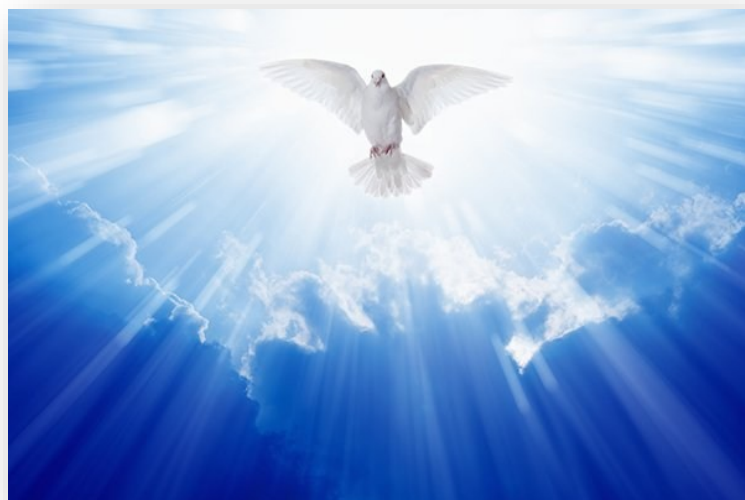

While the active phase of the appeal concludes on June 30, 2026, any gifts received through December 31, 2026 will continue to count toward your parish's 2026 CMAA goal. Since parishes will no longer be asked to formally promote the appeal during Masses and other parish activities after June 30, we encourage any parish needing additional support to reach out soon so we can help position you for success. We also want to remind parishes that any funds raised above a parish's assigned goal are returned directly to the parish to support its own ministries and pastoral needs.

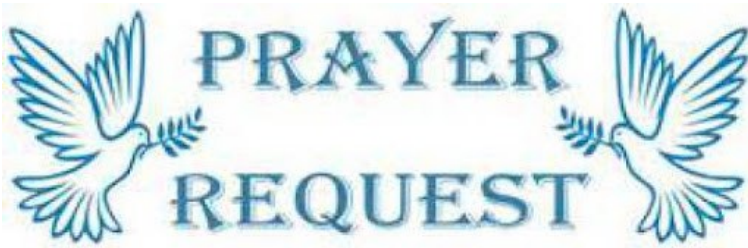

Vision & Overview

The 200th Anniversary of Catholicism in Hawaii is a year-long celebration (July 2026 – July 2027) marking the day the Missionaries of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary arrived in Honolulu. This anniversary year is not only remembrance —



it is an invitation: designed to honor the past 200 years of faith, strengthen the present community across every island, and inspire what comes next. Each gathering, liturgy, and celebration is a step toward the next 200 years of Catholic life in Hawai'i.

What it is

A year-long celebration - July 2026 through July 2027, anchored by major diocesan events and Vicariate-led celebrations.

What it honors

200 years of impact - Faith lived across generations — in parishes, schools, service, and spiritual formation.

What it builds

Future generations - A living mission that continues through community, leadership, culture, and renewal.

Purpose

Honor • Celebrate • Inspire - To honor the 200-year impact of Catholicism in Hawaii, celebrate the present community across every island, and inspire future generations to carry the mission forward.

Mission

A living mission today - To create a year of gatherings, formation, worship, and cultural expression that strengthens faith, unites communities, and renews commitment to service.

Vision

Deep roots. Bright future - A bicentennial year that feels like an inheritance — preserved with care, shared with love, and built to guide what comes next.



BICENTENNIAL LITURGICAL PLANNING GUIDE

Introduction

In preparation for the celebration of the 200th Anniversary of Catholicism in Hawai'i, the Diocesan Liturgical Commission, under the Office of Worship, is providing this guide to assist clergy and ministers in the liturgical planning for celebrations pertaining to this joyous occasion. All parishes and vicariates are to participate fully so that all the faithful have the opportunity to join together in commemorating this extraordinary time.

Opening Mass

The Fathers and Brothers of the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary and of Perpetual Adoration (SS.CC.) arrived in Honolulu's Harbor on July 7, 1827 and first went ashore on July 8, 1827. They offered the first Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on July 14, 1827.

Bishop Larry Silva has set the date of Thursday, July 9, 2026 to open the bicentennial celebration with Mass being offered on Oahu and in each vicariate of Kaua'i, Maui, and Hawai'i Island simultaneously at 6:00 PM.



The Proper of the Mass will be for the *Feast of Our Lady, Queen of Peace*, Principal Patroness of the Diocese of Honolulu. The presidential prayers can be taken from the Common of BVM or The BVM, Queen of Peace (Collection of Masses of the Blessed Virgin Mary #45). The Gloria is said, and the Preface of the BVM I-II or the proper Preface from the Collection is used.

The readings are taken from the Lectionary #707-712 or Collection #45 The Blessed Virgin Mary, Queen of Peace: Isaiah 9:1-3, 5-6; Psalm 85:9ab-10; 11-12, 13-14; Luke 1:26-38

The sample *Universal Prayer* below may be used and translated into different languages in a multicultural celebration.

Anniversary Mass

Parishes are encouraged to celebrate their anniversary of dedication of the parish church in a special way to highlight the bicentennial year. Prayers and music should carry the theme of the Dedication of a Church.

Community Engagement

When having Opening Mass and/or Special Masses, we encourage community engagement by inviting Societies, Orders, Organizations, Civic leaders:

- Knights of Malta
- Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem
- Order of Saint Lazarus of Jerusalem
- Knights of Columbus

Religious Communities

- Royal Order of Kamehameha * Ahahui Kaahumanu
- Daughters and Sons of Hawaiian Warriors
- Government Officials (County Mayors, Senators, Representatives, etc)

Cultural Engagement

These cultures are part of the Diocese and can be incorporated into liturgies, whether as a lector (in their language) or in universal prayers (in their language), while in cultural attire.

* Hawaiian * Chinese * Chuukese * Filipino * Korean * Samoan * Spanish * Tongan * Vietnamese

The use of the Sacred Gesture in the Liturgy is allowed in the Diocese of Honolulu. As a reminder, the music used must be of a sacred, not secular, character, and is to be appropriate to the liturgical season. Also, since liturgical gestures are acts of praise and worship and not entertainment, applause after the gestures is not appropriate. This should be announced or included in the worship aids as needed.

RE: PLENARY INDULGENCES FOR SPECIAL JUBILEE YEAR OF ST. FRANCIS IN THE DIOCESE OF HONOLULU

On the occasion of the Year of Saint Francis, which runs until January 2027, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father), also applicable in the form of suffrage for the souls in Purgatory:

1) to members: - of the Franciscan Families of the First, Second and Third Orders Regular and Secular;

- of Institutes of Consecrated Life, Societies of Apostolic Life and public or private associations of the faithful, male and female, who observe the Rule of Saint Francis or are inspired by his spirituality or perpetuate his charism in any form;

2) to all the faithful without distinction who, with a heart detached from sin, participate in the Year of Saint Francis by visiting, in the form of a pilgrimage, any Franciscan conventual church or place of worship anywhere in the world dedicated to Saint Francis or connected to him for any reason, and there devoutly follow the Jubilee rites or spend at least a reasonable period of time in pious meditation and raise prayers to God so that, following the example of Saint Francis, feelings of Christian charity towards their neighbors and authentic vows of harmony and peace among peoples may spring forth in their hearts, concluding with the Our Father, the Creed and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Clare and all the Saints of the Franciscan Family.

The elderly, the sick and those who take care of them, and all those who are unable to leave their homes for serious reasons may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence, provided they detach themselves from any sin and intend to fulfil the three usual conditions as soon as possible, if they unite themselves spiritually to the jubilee celebrations of the Year of Saint Francis, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, the pains or sufferings of their lives.

Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa (Honolulu) * St. Francis Church (Kalaupapa) * Holy Trinity Church (Kuliouou) * St. Rita Church (Nanakuli) * Immaculate Conception Church (Lihue) * Christ the King Church (Kahului) *

St. Damien Church (Kaunakakai) * Sacred Hearts (Lanai) * St. Michael the Archangel Church (Kailua-Kona) * and St. Joseph Church (Hilo).

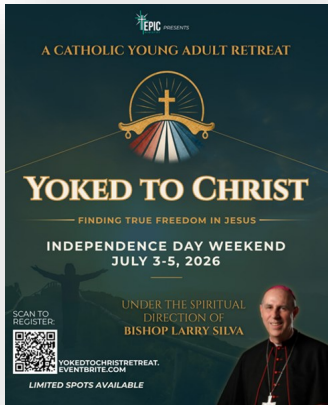
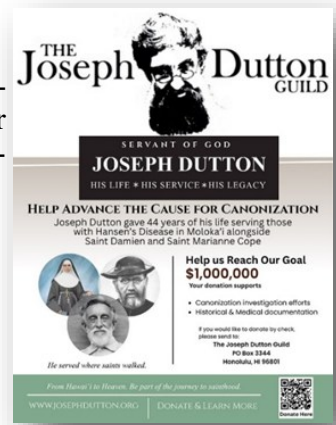

Stewardship Reflection: Letting God Take Us Beyond Ourselves

(ICSC e-bulletin | February 2026)

Dear brothers and sisters,

Who are we as disciples of Jesus Christ? How is stewardship part of the life of the disciple? How do we lead others toward this spiritual way of life? These are the questions that stewardship leaders constantly ask themselves. There is no one answer to these essential questions, of course, and no singular way of carrying out the role we have as pastoral leaders who are dedicated to forming people as stewards. Yet, we know that this way of life is filled with meaning and purpose, and we sense the impact it may have on others in our community. “Mature disciples make a conscious, firm decision, carried out in action, to be followers of Jesus Christ no matter the cost to themselves. Stewardship is an expression of discipleship, with the power to change how we understand and live out our lives.” (*Stewardship: A Disciple’s Response*, Introduction)

How do we lead people to such living discipleship? In his pastoral letter, *The Joy of the Gospel*, our late pontiff,

Pope Francis pointed to the importance of an encounter with Christ as the beginning point:

Thanks solely to this encounter – or renewed encounter – with God’s love, which blossoms into an enriching friendship, we are liberated from our narrowness and self-absorption. We become fully human when we become more than human, when we let God bring us beyond ourselves in order to attain the fullest truth of our being (*The Joy of the Gospel*, 8).

We rely on the presence of the Holy Spirit to enflame our hearts and open our minds as the beginning point for this encounter with God’s love. As members of Christ’s Body, we also recognize the responsibility we have to witness to the power of faith and the impact of living as disciples in our lives. This is one of the great gifts of stewardship in the life of the Church: as we “let God take us beyond ourselves,” we witness to the transforming power of stewardship as “an expression of discipleship.” We evangelize. A reflection question for stewardship leaders: How do you witness to the impact of living as a disciple who embraces stewardship as a way of life?
