A year-long celebration marking 200 years since the establishment of the Diocese of Honolulu — honoring the roots of Catholicism in Hawai'i and the courageous missionaries who first carried the faith to these shores. Together, we remember the past, give thanks for the vibrant Church alive today, and boldly step forward in faith, inspiring the next 200 years of Catholic life in Hawai'i.



The *opening Mass* to launch the bicentennial celebration was solemnly celebrated on Thursday, July 9, 2026. *Bishop Larry Silva* presided and priests and deacons concelebrated while the Religious nuns and brothers and lay people filled up the pews of the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa. A dinner fellowship was served at the school cafeteria and church grounds while Hawaiian music and dances were performed. There was also a simultaneous celebration of the Opening Mass at 6:00 PM to launch the bicentennial celebration in each vicariate of Kaua'i, Maui, and Hawai'i Island.

**Freedom 250 America
Happy 250th Birthday
Of the United States of America
(1776-2026)**

The 250th birthday of the United

States, celebrated on July 4, 2026, marks 250 years since the adoption of the Declaration of Independence in 1776. The nationwide commemoration—officially branded Freedom250—is planned as a large, year-long series of events honoring American history, civic ideals, and cultural heritage.

The semi-quincentennial highlights the moment when the thirteen colonies formally declared independence from Great Britain, beginning the political journey that shaped the modern United States. Federal, state, and local governments, along with private organizations and citizens, are encouraged to participate in the celebration.

In summary, the USA's 250th birthday in 2026 is a historic, large-scale celebration of American independence, featuring national ceremonies, fireworks, cultural exhibitions, and community events across the country—echoing the spirit of the 1976 Bicentennial but on an even grander scale.

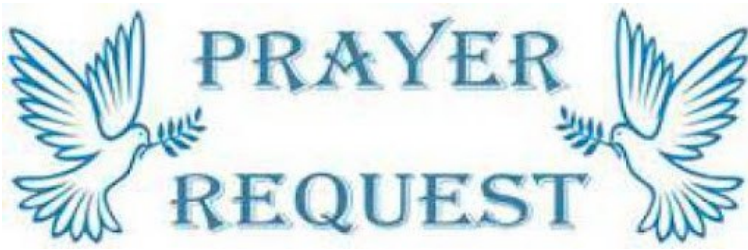

RE: PLENARY INDULGENCES FOR SPECIAL JUBILEE YEAR OF ST. FRANCIS IN THE DIOCESE OF HONOLULU

On the occasion of the Year of Saint Francis, which runs until January 2027, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father), also applicable in the form of suffrage for the souls in Purgatory:

- 1) to members: - of the Franciscan Families of the First, Second and Third Orders Regular and Secular;
- of Institutes of Consecrated Life, Societies of Apostolic Life and public or private associations of the faithful, male and female, who observe the Rule of Saint Francis or are inspired by his spirituality or perpetuate his charism in any form;
- 2) to all the faithful without distinction who, with a heart detached from sin, participate in the Year of Saint Francis by visiting, in the form of a pilgrimage, any



Franciscan conventual church or place of worship anywhere in the world dedicated to Saint Francis or connected to him for any reason, and there devoutly follow the Jubilee rites or spend at least a reasonable period of time in pious meditation and raise prayers to God so that, following the example of Saint Francis, feelings of Christian charity towards their neighbors and authentic vows of harmony and peace among peoples may spring forth in their hearts, concluding with the Our Father, the Creed and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Clare and all the Saints of the Franciscan Family.

The elderly, the sick and those who take care of them, and all those who are unable to leave their homes for serious reasons may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence, provided they detach themselves from any sin and intend to fulfil the three usual conditions as soon as possible, if they unite themselves spiritually to the jubilee celebrations of the Year of Saint Francis, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, the pains or sufferings of their lives.

Over the years, the grotto has served as a place of prayer, devotion, and remembrance for many faithful members of our parish and the Portuguese Catholic community. It stands as a visible expression of our love and devotion to Our Lady and as a testament to the faith of the Portuguese immigrants who established and cared for this sacred place.

Unfortunately, in recent years the grotto has been increasingly affected by acts of vandalism, misuse of the property, and issues related to homelessness in the surrounding area. Despite efforts to maintain and protect the site, these circumstances have created ongoing concerns regarding safety, security, and the preservation of the cherished devotional space.

After careful consideration, prayer and consultation, we have determined that it is necessary to take action regard-

ing the future of the grotto. This decision has not been made lightly and comes only after recognizing the challenges that have made it increasingly difficult to ensure the sacredness, dignity, upkeep, and protection of our site.

We understand that this news may be difficult for many parishioners, especially those whose families have longstanding ties to the *Irmandade* and to the devotion of Our Lady of the Mount. Please know that we deeply respect the spiritual significance of the grotto and the memories and traditions associated with it, along with the significance that it holds to Our Lady of the Mount Church.

We ask for your prayers, understanding, and support as we move forward. Our shared devotion to the Blessed Mother remains strong, and we are committed to honoring the legacy of the *Irmandade* and preserving its spiritual heritage in a manner that continues to inspire faith for future generations.

Our Lady of the Mount Church and its parishioners will continue to be welcomed and have access to the grotto upon request to the *Irmandade de Nossa Senhora do Monte* Executive Board.
